- 5. Reports:
 - a. School Board Trustee Report Kim Armstrong (Board Agendas/Minutes)
 - i. From the most recent board meeting:
 - The St. Albert Public School Board of Trustees approves the transition to the correct spelling of Keenooshayo Elementary School to Kinosayo Elementary School.
 - Approved school transportation fees for 22/23 school year. There is no change to the fee. We are in a situation where we are in a deficit in the transportation in the portfolio. There has been no change in the funding so something has to change. Therefore the transportation committee will make recommendations going forward.
 - We are in conversations to bring an electric bus pilot project to our division. The bus contractor and the electric bus manufacturer are interested in making a pilot project in the Alberta market.
 - The education budget came out. Funding for each division is based on bridge funding and is weighted on a moving average. Our board is at a disadvantage because it is continually growing. Transitional funding did come through.
 - a. St. Albert Public School Board reserves are ~14% right now. We have been responsible and purposely saving funds. The Alberta government will be limiting reserves to 3-4% reserves (which would be about \$100,000). The government would take the extra funds in reserve to achieve the 3-4%. SO the board is looking at how we can invest the reserves rather than having the Alberta government take the reserved funds.

- b. A lot of the funds are held by individual schools. There are some boards that have no reserves at all.
- The board has made recommendations on Student fees and regulations.
 Have not received feedback on that.
- The board approved a 3 year capital plan outlining the infrastructure needs and requirements for school buildings.
- Learning disruptions grant was listed in the approved budget by the government - Funding has been set aside for mental health support and the new curriculum. More to be communicated about this.
- Stakeholders workshop was held in person. It was a solid turnout and was a positive experience to be able to hold it in person again.
- There are 2 public board meetings in May.

- vi. Education week is next week. Activities are still being planned.
- vii. Asked our division to put out the tender for the before and after school program. It has been St. Albert Daycare for the past several years. The tender is out right now and will close on May 4.
 - Current registrations would be honoured
 - Possession date will be August 15
- viii. There has been notable success with the Grade 2 and 3's targeted reading and math groups. We are going to start with grade 1's and move out some of the 2's and 3's that are on a good trajectory.
- ix. Kindergarten registrations:
 - 45 registrations per year is normal. We are on track for normal. There is room in Ronald Harvey for future growth.
 - So far this year there are:
 - a. 23 registrations for am program
 - b. 14 registrations for full day program
 - c. Still waiting on a few registrations
 - 60 registrations (last year) is considered high
- x. We had a great experience with the school book "Wish Tree" By Katherine Applegate. The "One book one school" project was organized by our school Librarian Zena Harris. The project had every student bring the Wish Tree book home and is read with the entire family. At the end there is going to be tree planting. All the books are to be brought back and they get gifted to another school. The only cost for this project was Zena's (Librarian) time.
- xi. Question regarding if schools in other areas of St. Albert that are full, is it alright to recommend them to our school?
 - It depends on the grade. It depends on the configurations of the classes.
 Some grades are full, some have room.
 - Example: The grade 4's at some point they have to put together. 2 classes but then they would pull literacy and numeracy into 3 groups.
 THis is the problem because there is no money to make an additional class. There may be an opportunity for additional funds. Funds are released based on the number of students. Modified 2.5 classes
- xii. We will continue with Staggered Entry for the 22/23 school year. Meet the staff night will be on August 30, 2022
